Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for UG BA/BCom. II & III Classes under Rashtriya Uchhatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) has been implemented w.e.f. session 2013-14, where the courses are measured in terms of credits. Credit is a method/unit to measure the volume of content, learning effort, achievement of learning and weightage of the course. The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course usually in terms of instructional hours per week assigned to it. For purpose of credit determination, one lecture or tutorial of one hour a week & practical of two hours a week is considered as one credit. Himachal Pradesh University Shimla has implemented new CBCS as framed by UGC since the session 2016-17 in which the student is required to attain/secure 132 credits in three year degree course or specified as per guidelines.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

a) Core Course

A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a core course.

b) Elective Course:

A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an elective course.

- (i) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):- Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- (ii) Dissertation/Project An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work. A candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- (iii) Elective (GE) Course An elective course chosen from related discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective.

Note: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

c) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)

The Ability Enhancement Course may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement SEC courses are value-based and are aimed at providing hands on training, competencies, skills, etc.

(i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):- These two courses are mandatory for all disciplines.

i) Environmental Science, ii) English Communication /Hindi Communication / MIL Communication.

(ii) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):- These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based knowledge and comprises both theory and lab/hands-on/training/fieldwork.

d) Practical/Tutorials (one each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper)

Introducing research component in Under-Graduate courses project work/dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real situation/difficult problem. Practical (PR) component has been included in every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper. The list of practical's to be conducted by candidate has been provided alongside each of such courses. 20 marks were given for the practical examinations.

SIGNIFICANT NOTES REGARDING NEP

1. The prescribed credit weight age includes Lecture, Tutorial and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
4. Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
5. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
6. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
7. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.
8. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECS (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
9. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
10. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
11. To pursue an Honours & Honours with research in the 4th year, students will have to successfully complete 3-year UG Degree and choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
12. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
14. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84. credits in a 4-year. UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline
16. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

*As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications and changes.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES & GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND CONDITIONS:

1. AGE: A Candidate should not be more than 23 years of age (for Boys) and not of more than 25 years of age (in case of Girls) as on **01 July, 2026**. However, for SC/ST candidates a relaxation of three years in age is allowed.
2. The Vice-Chancellor of H.P.U. may in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice- Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
3. Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to physically disabled candidates.

ACADEMIC QUALIFICATION:

A candidate/student who has passed the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (any Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by various bodies of the University will be eligible to apply for admission to B.A./ B. Com Ist semester under NEP 2020. The admission will, however, be determined on the basis of merit.

ADMISSION TO B.A./B COM 1ST SEMESTER:

(A) Candidate seeking admission in **B.A./B. Com 1st semester** must have secured 33 percent in marks at 10+2 level or equivalent examination.

(B) The candidate who have passed or cleared all the five subjects including English from N.O.S is eligible to take admission in B.A.1st semester.

(C) A Student placed under compartment in 10+2 class will not be eligible for admission in B.A./B. Com courses under NEP 2020.

NOTE: All admissions are provisional unless regularized by the University and the College will assume no responsibility in case the University for any reason whatsoever does not approve the admission of a student.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

STEP-I: Every candidate seeking admission shall apply for admission on the prescribed **Admission Form** that will be provided by/ obtained from the admission committee convenor. The admission form should be filled legibly by each candidate in his/her own handwriting.

STEP-II: A candidate seeking admission should personally appear before the concerned Admission Committee along with the required original and certified documents and he/she must also be accompanied by Parents/Guardian at the time of admission.

STEP-III: After the approval of the Admission Form by the Admission Committee it would be forwarded to the Scrutiny Committee and finally the admission to the College would be granted on merit-basis and on the recommendation of the Principal. The Principal, however reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.

STEP-IV: If the admission of the candidate is approved / recommended by the Principal, the candidate shall have to deposit the fee/ dues as per the instructions displayed on the College notice board. The number of seats is maximum 80 in each core subject and these seats will be filled on the basis of merit respectively. The students are advised to deposit their fee and funds within time after consulting the merit list that would be displayed on the College notice board.

STEP-V: After depositing the fee the candidate will seek the enrolment of the College as a regular student. The admission will however remain **PURELY PROVISIONAL** in nature unless it is approved by the HPU.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION:

The candidates must submit/produce the following documents along with legibly and completely filled Admission Form: -

- I. Original Certificates (along with their photocopies) Matriculation onwards.
- II. Two passport size photographs. (One is to be pasted on the admission form and second is to be pinned for Identity Card)
- III. Original Character Certificate issued by the institution last attended (for new admissions/fresh candidates only)
- IV. In case of gap year self declaration certificate is needed.
- V. Category Certificate for SC/ST/Physically Handicapped students only.
- VI. Sports and Cultural Certificates if seeking admission under the Sports or Cultural Quota.
- VII. HP Board equivalence Certificate for the candidate who have passed 10+2 from other Board/ University than the HP Board. (HPBOSE). All such candidates (except) HP Board candidates) will also have to produce original **Migration Certificate** from Board/ University from which they have passed the previous (last) examination.
- VIII. Private students seeking admission to the College for the first time should submit their recent Character Certificate (not more than six months old) issued by a Gazetted Officer/ MLA/ Pradhan of M.C./ Panchayat.
- IX. Certificate of Bonafide Himachali (For the girl students who belong to H.P). Only the girl students who have Bonafide Himachali Certificate are eligible for exemption of tuition fees.
- X. A Copy of Aadhaar Card

Note: Submission of false information of any kind for the purpose of admission is a serious offence. Any such act will be viewed seriously and penal proceedings can be initiated against such offenders and their admission will also stand cancelled in such situation.

MIGRATION:

Inter-institution Migration (Either from one College to another or from a College to ICDEOL and vice-versa) of students will be allowed when no-objection is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institutions. A student can apply for migration only after the result is declared by the HPU and has to produce the latest DMC

RESERVATION OF SEATS:

Admission to UG Courses shall be open to all persons irrespective of race, creed, caste or class subject to the conditions laid down in the Roster issued/notified by the H.P.U.

Point-1 The candidates seeking admission under any category or quota mentioned in the Roster, i.e., SC, ST, Handicap, Sports or cultural, will have to produce the Original Certificate, issued by a Competent Authority, of his/ her category or quota at the time of admission to get the benefit of reservation.

- CCA will be calculated on the basis of these three components i.e. Attendance, Mid-Term Test & Assignment/ Seminar.

Note: - The student absent from the Mid-Term test will have to pay fine of Rs 50/- per paper and he/she will request the concerned teacher for re-test.

ANNUAL EXAMINATION (70 MARKS):

It refers to the examination conducted by the HPU at the end of the year. It will be based on the whole syllabus and will be of **Three hours** duration.

NOTE:-(i) Only those students will be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination who have been successful in the CCA.

(ii) The HPU may from time-to-time revise and amend (change) the regulations and curriculum after due approval of different bodies and authorities of the University.

Note: The fee and fund structure given above is subject to change as per the directions/ guidelines issued by the competent authorities from time to time.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS:

1. There is roll on admission for students of BA/B. Com 2nd& 3rd Year of this college. They are directed to take admission within due dates specified by HP University, even if results of previous semesters are not declared.
2. Admission form should be duly signed by parents / guardians, failing which their application for admission will not be entertained.
3. Students with their record of misconduct or involvement in ragging in previous years will not be given admission in the current year.
4. Fee once paid will be refunded as per UGC and HPU guidelines
5. Every student must give an undertaking on the admission form that he/she will not indulge in ragging of any kind.
6. No student will be allowed simultaneously to join two full time degree courses.

EXAMINATION & VACATIONS SCHEDULE:

The schedule is the subject to change as per the latest HPU/ HP Government Notification

SCHOLARSHIP AND FEE CONCESSION:

A number of government sponsored scholarship schemes are available to the eligible and deserving students. Information regarding the dates and eligibility conditions are from time to time notified on college notice board. Online applications need to be made at HP Government website <https://scholarships.gov.in> for the scholarship schemes like, centrally sponsored post matric scholarship scheme for SC students, Kalpana Chawla Chatravriti yojana, central sector scheme of scholarships for college and university students etc. The Scholarship Committee guides the students about the application process. Only pass students of previous class are eligible to apply for any kind of scholarship and their application should be supported by the relevant documents.

GENERAL GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS:

Discipline is the back bone of any educational institution and students are advised to maintain decorum and discipline in and outside the class rooms. Students need to observe the following rules and regulations: -

1. Every student must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and university.
2. Breach of college discipline can result in the expulsion/termination of the student from college rolls.
3. The students of the college are advised to behave courteously with each other and with the staff of the college. A serious view will be taken of any form of discourtesy.
4. For favorable academic atmosphere, students are advised to maintain decorum while be in the college campus.
5. Students are advised to carry their identity card and they can be asked to produce it at any time during college hours.
6. Students are advised to read the notices daily displayed on college notice board.

NOTE: - The students are advised to be very careful while selecting and filling their (DSC) & (SEC) Subjects. These subjects once opted will not be changed under any circumstances.

GUIDELINES TO AVAIL LEAVE:

1. It is compulsory for all students to get their leaves pre sanctioned before proceeding on leave for whatever reason.
2. Leave up to six days will be sanctioned by concerned teacher and more than six days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
3. If a student remains absent for continuous ten days without leave application, his/her name will be struck off from college rolls.
4. Once the name is struck off, the student must seek re-admission within seven days. A re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- shall be charged for the first re-admission and Rs. 200/- for the second re-admission. No re-admission shall be permitted thereafter.
5. Absence per period = Rupee1/period.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College Library plays a vital role in grooming the overall personality of the students. It helps in inspiring and inculcating reading habits among the students.

In colleges, the library occupies a prominent position and it is an important and integral part of the teaching programme. It is not merely a depository of books, but an active workshop instrument in the production of or original thinking. The aim of college education and college libraries is inter-related. College library extends opportunities for self-education to the deserving and enthusiastic students without any distinction. These libraries develop in each student a sense of responsibility in the pursuit of knowledge. The College Library encourages students to acquire, evaluate, and enhance their knowledge while keeping themselves updated with emerging trends in various fields of learning for higher education and academic development. To facilitate effective learning and research, the college also provides a well-equipped reading room with internet facility for the benefit of students.

LIBRARY RULES

The following shall be entitled to use the college library and borrow books for home reading:

- Library will be open from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M. on all working days.
- Students shall be permitted to keep issued books for a period of two weeks.
- A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged from the student for keeping books beyond the period of two weeks.
- The faculty members can borrow four books at a time.
- Library books will be issued to a student only on the production of a duly signed student's Identity-cum-Library Card.
- A student will be responsible for all the books issued to him or her on the card even if the card is lost.
- Marking, underlining, or writing on library books is strictly forbidden.
- A 'No Dues Certificate' must be obtained by each student from the Assistant Librarian while withdrawing from the college.
- Perfect order and silence shall be maintained in the library at all times.

Identity-cum-Library Card Issuance and Loss

Identity cards are issued by the Assistant Librarian upon presenting the admission fee receipt and students must carry them at all times for verification by college authorities. In the event of loss, the student must immediately notify the Assistant Librarian in writing and provide a copy of a police F.I.R. to maintain membership; a duplicate card may then be issued for a Rs. 20 fee. Students remain strictly responsible for any misuse of their card.

Ragging is a criminal offence. It is strictly banned by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, either by words or by conduct. Any student who aids or abets such an action shall be guilty of ragging. Ragging is strictly prohibited and if any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged to initiate legal action and also expel the guilty student(s) from the college.

ANTI SMOKING / ANTI TOBACCO

Smoking and use of tobacco products are strictly prohibited in the college campus. Anyone found smoking or using tobacco products will have to pay a fine of Rs 200/- in addition to suspension or expulsion from the college.
